"When European nations chose to engulf themselves in the flames of the Great War during the summer of 1914, most Americans were prepared to hew to Wilson's admonitions to avoid the conflagration. Over time both Wilson and the majority of Americans found it difficult to remain on the high moral ground of absolute neutrality. By April of 1917, most found it impossible to resist the allure of intervention on the grounds of making the world safe for democracy and the hopes of building a lasting peace. A few committed pacifists held firm in their convictions that war was inherently immoral and refused to back the American war effort. It took tremendous courage to stick to these abstract ideals in the face of a public, zealous as all new converts, now committed to Allied victory..."1

PeaceWays was founded by Rebecca Shelley, a Professor at the University of Michigan, who was later named the "peace poet." Shelley not only was committed to establishing peace and democracy, but married a German conscientious objector to WWI. Rebecca was in a circle of literary friends and feminists committed to peace. Despite persecution, Shelley and others remained dedicated to non-violence throughout their lives. Shelley lived in a natural setting in rural Michigan where she wrote poetry and worked for peace until her passing in 1984.

PeaceWays was refounded in 1989 and continues to seek peaceful solutions in a world torn apart by war.
